St Mary's Parish Feast Day

We are fast approaching our inaugural Parish Feast Day on Sunday 11 August 2024 commencing with Mass at 10.00am.

The date was chosen as the closest Sunday to coincide with the Feast Day of St Mary MacKillop on 8 August and the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on 15 August.

This will now be a permanent annual event in the Parish Calendar.

The annual Mass attendance count during May, indicated our Parish has an average strength at 231 for both Masses at Maryborough.

The 2021 Census shows the population of Maryborough at 18558 with 2560 registering Catholic as their faith, which indicates we only have 9% of the Catholic population attending Mass.

The Census population for Tiaro is 758. With 136 nominating Catholic as their faith.

The Mass count at Tiaro was an average of 18 over the count period which represents 13% of the Catholic population attending

The Parish has 3 distinct groups each with a preference for attending weekend Mass; these are divided into: Sat Evening; Sunday Morning at St Mary's and Sacred Heart Tiaro.

Sadly, it is a known fact that our Parishioners from the 3 groups have either never met or have little social acquaintance or interaction with each other.

To address this, Fr Lucius has taken the initiative to introduce the Parish Feast Day with the main theme focused on gathering the 3 flocks together at St Marys to jointly celebrate Mass and Holy Eucharist as one united in faith.

After Mass there will be ample opportunity to establish new acquaintances; renew old friendships and generally foster lasting relationships as we enjoy a morning tea provided by our combined team of dedicated volunteers. There will also be musical accompaniment provided by our cherished College and School students.

If we focus on being optimistic, we could see 249 cups of tea being served on the day and if you know of any of the 2447 missing Catholics in our area, please feel free to invite them along, we have plenty of beverages, nibbles, smiles and open hearts.

We may even find time for a prayer or exchange of ideas on how we can enhance our congregation to ensure an increase in numbers for next year's Parish Feast Day.


