BLEST BE GOD THE FATHER, AND THE ONLY BEGOTTEN SON OF GOD, AND ALSO THE HOLY SPIRIT, FOR HE HAS SHOWN US HIS MERCIFUL LOVE.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

There's this little boy named Timmy. Timmy was very afraid of the lightning and the thunder. His mom went into his room during a thunderstorm and said,

"Now, Timmy, don't be afraid. God is right here in this room with you." He said, "Okay, Mom, I won't be afraid."

But then as the mom went into her room and started to get ready for bed, the lightning clapped, and the thunder rolled, and Timmy screamed bloody loudly. Timmy's mom went back into the room and said, "Honey, I thought I told you, you don't need to be afraid. God is right here in the room with you."

Timmy said, "Mom, I know God is right here in this room with me, but I need someone with skin on."

Like Timmy, we all need God as well as each other, as God does not exist in solitary individualism but in a community of love and sharing. God is not a loner. This means that a Christian in search of God must avoid every tendency to isolate him or herself from the community. St Paul was quick to add that the way to achieve this is through a loving relationship with one another.

Now the Easter season is over. It was concluded last Sunday with the Pentecost. Today we return to Sundays in Ordinary Time. If there is one theme that marks the Ordinary Time of the liturgical year, it is the theme of growth in Christian living.

The liturgical colour green symbolizes life and growth as we know from nature. Ordinary Time will take us to the end of the liturgical year. If the theme of the Ordinary Time is growth, why then does the church choose to come back to it with the solemnity of the Blessed Trinity? Growth is a practical, everyday concern but the Trinity seems to be a mystery to us which we can always relate to through the sacraments.

Therefore, brothers and sisters, as we return to Ordinary Time and to the daily challenges of living the Christian life, let us know that we are not alone in the struggle. God the Father is with us, Jesus Christ the Son of God is on our side, the Holy Spirit the Power of God Most High is in us. That is our faith, and we are proud to profess it. Amen.
