HAVE A LITTLE MORE FAITH!

We human beings prefer to have sufficient proof that something will work before we venture forth into an unknown. For example, after the Discovery shuttle disaster, NASA spent years amassing proof that shuttle travel would be safe. Nevertheless, it took great trust for the next team of astronauts to venture forth into space. Proof is easier than trust

Parents understand well the responsibility and privilege of calling their children beyond where they are at any stage in their lives. For example, encouraging a toddler to walk, a youngster to ride a bike, a teenager to make right decisions, etc. Basic to this process is parents teaching their children to trust their own innate abilities and grow into capable and independent adults.

Even though the disciples had already experienced some of Jesus' miracles, this new situation at sea was different: the violence of the storm threatened their lives and was beyond their power to control. Jesus' care for them and his power over creation led them to greater faith and trust. Jesus is the "parent" who calls us, his disciples today, to go beyond our own previous experiences and our limited understanding of his presence in our lives. In the "storms" of our own lives, Jesus is always present-through other people, within ourselves, in the very challenge of the situation. Each challenge in life offers us more and more reasons to trust in Jesus-concrete evidence of our

Finally, as we read in Marks Gospel today, Jesus is certainly with his experienced fishermen who know well the peril of a storm at sea. But what they do not "yet" know fully is the extent of Jesus' power and of his "care" for them. So, from what disaster does Jesus really save the disciples? From a storm? Yes, but much more: he saves them from their own lack of faith and trust in him and an even bigger disaster than a storm at sea. So does Jesus do for us. Let us therefore pray my dear sisters and brothers that Jesus will increase our faith to always discern the depth of his




